


**MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING And**

**Thursday, January 23, 2025, at 5:00 p.m., Meeting Agenda**

1. Vice President, David Dominguez, called meeting to order **5:04** p.m. and declared meeting open to the public. A quorum of directors was present. Present were David Dominguez, Ginny Barmore, Ben Burnham, Nancy Martinez, and Cecil Lee Absent: James Ward, Luke Brown, and General Manager Greg Perrin. Emily Rogers, attorney for the District, was also present via Zoom.

Rebecca explained field time would be 48 days on version one and 24 days on version two, She also explained the time it would take to analyze the samples (because of the doubling of the samples on version one). Version one would have 60 samples and version two would have 30 samples. Rebecca stated she is proposing to assist RCGCD with water sampling that consists of water level measurements, water chemistry, and analysis. Rebecca stated she has been working and would like to continue working in the southern part of the county (San Solomon Springs/Balmorhea area) and collecting samples there and she sees it to work there. She would work in the southern part of the county and collect samples there. She knows we want sampling done in the rest of the county, she does not have the time or the bandwidth to sample the rest of the county, but she would be happy to train somebody if RCGCD would like to hire someone that would do sampling in the greater part of the county. James Beach Said he and Greg have talked about this to get a better understanding where there might be an impact and could be a good foundation for discussion for next month.
